

Nuclear Medicine Virtual Interview Guidelines

Dear applicant,

We are delighted that you will be joining us for the virtual interviews for radiology residency at the University of Wisconsin. Below you will find some of the guidelines for the virtual interview process to ensure a welcoming environment and seamless process for everyone involved in the interviews.

- Please make sure to test your audio and video connection prior to your scheduled interview day. We are utilizing the Zoom platform for the virtual interviews. If you are unsure of the technical set-up, please email our program managers and we can run a connectivity test with you in advance.
- Please make sure to use your audio and video connection through a laptop or desktop PC. If you would like to join the session using your tablet or smartphone make sure to inform our program manager in advance to account for the differences in IT set-up
- During the interview please make sure to have your camera on through the in-person virtual sessions. During scheduled breaks or individual activities, you are permitted to turn your audio and video off.
- Please try to complete the interview in private, with minimal surrounding distractions
- Please do not forward any links or resources provided to you for the interview day with any other individuals
- Please do not share the questions that you are asked during the interview with other applicants
- If you are unable to make it to the scheduled session or if you are having technical difficulties joining any part of the scheduled sessions, please reach out to our program coordinator
