For success in Phase 3 and applying to Radiology, we recommend:

- Take at least 4 weeks of Radiology electives (any of the elective options)
- Communicate with Dr. Meduri and Katie Yang to get matched up with a mentor within the department
- Get exposure to different areas of medicine as possible during your Phase 3, this will set you up for better success as a Radiologist in the long run
- Take your Step 2 as early as possible but at least by the end of the summer of Phase 3
- Away rotations are not required and are recommended only in specific circumstances. If you are interested in an away rotation, you should plan to do this as early as possible.
- The majority of residency interviews are scheduled in late October, November and December
- Apply to at least 35+ programs; the number of programs you should interview at will depend on the relative proportion of invitations you are extended. You will want to interview at roughly 10-15 Radiology programs.
